Resilient Infrastructure

- Draft Goal: Communities and businesses of the Gorge have reliable, resilient access to infrastructure, including attainable housing, internet access, and emergency services, to support future population demands and economic opportunities.

Assets: Market Access, Modal Diversity

Interstates and Highways both East/West and North/South

Airports

- Hood River and Columbia Gorge Regional airports
- Close Proximity to PDX

Rail Service for transport of goods in both OR and WA

River access, including barge transportation along the Columbia

Bicycle, pedestrian and transit systems

Challenges

- Aging infrastructure- ability to maintain/sustain key assets
- Business development requires enhancing transportation infrastructure to support key industries
- Constrained financial resources
- Limited rail options, particularly passenger rail
- Growth and congestion, including from tourism
- Gaps in public transportation, bike and pedestrian systems
- Safety concerns
- Rural/dispersed nature of the region
- Long commutes, partially created by housing constraints
- Emergency preparedness

Modified Goal: Transportation
