In the short term, the U.S. economy is fine*


- GDP is up
 - Investment in new manufacturing facilities has soared
- Industrial production is holding steady
- Personal income has been increasing
- Retail sales have been increasing
- Job creation continues to be strong
- Inflation has dropped
- Wages are growing faster than inflation

Corporate profits have gone up by close to 50 percent





Spending on Manufacturing Structures






Klickitat: the big three industries in 2022 7,264 jobs (72 more than in 2021)











Klickitat County: change in jobs since Feb. 2020

Skamania County: change in jobs since Feb. 2020


- •Total: +60 jobs

 - Other government: -10






Median wage increases, average slips


Median and average hourly wage, adjusted for inflation, Klickitat County




Median and average wages increase

Median and average hourly wage, adjusted for inflation, Skamania County





Taxable Retail Sales Soar, Revert to Trend


Taxable Sales at Retail Stores in Klickitat County, Millions of Seasonallyand Inflation-Adjusted Dollars


Taxable Sales at Retail Stores in Klickitat County, Millions of Seasonallyand Inflation-Adjusted Dollars


Taxable Sales at Retail Stores in Skamania County, Millions of Seasonally- and Inflation-Adjusted Dollars


Taxable Sales at Retail Stores in Skamania County, Millions of Seasonally- and Inflation-Adjusted Dollars
